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CORRESPONDENCE

- PACOG sent information for membership. After a general discussion, it was decided not to join because of the cost.
- Keep PA Beautiful has a grant program to provide security cameras to prevent illegal dumping.
- TCRP has their draft Comprehensive Plan available for review and comment. The link is on the COG website.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Matt Stonerod talked about the upcoming Elizabethtown Borough Bicentennial to be held August 12-19th. There will be a parade on the 19th that will be a three to four hour event. The parade detour will close parts of Rt 209. Other activities include a weeklong carnival at the park and a Lee Greenwood concert. Someone will be coming to COG with more details.

GUEST SPEAKER Bruce Beardsley, COSTARS Marketing Manager, gave a presentation about the COSTARS purchasing program. Using the COSTARS program allows you to purchase directly from the approved vendors and not have to go out to bid. There are two kinds of state approved vendor contracts: COSTARS and State-wide. The State-wide contract may or may not sell directly to municipalities, this is noted on the contract webpage. State contracts are fixed price and not negotiable and are usually the lowest available prices. However, COSTAR contracts are a bit negotiable. Pick several COSTAR vendors and negotiate your best price for your specific item. The 2017 PA Procurement Expo & Forum to be held on Sept. 6 and 7, 2017 at the Harrisburg Farm Show Complex and will feature many COSTARS vendors. There will be seminars and training for municipal purchasing. He also reviewed the aggregate purchase process. These material purchases are different than other material contracts. For aggregates, you must complete a mini-bid and request a price from all COSTAR vendors for that specific material that are in your County. Currently, there is no statewide COSTARS contract for in-place paving. Some small pre-fab construction projects may also be available. Chris Dietz asked if they have ever looked at a municipality's annual spending and see how much might have been saved if everything had been purchased through COSTARS.

OLD BUSINESS

- There was no new information on the Dirt and Gravel Road program.
- Most of the COG flagger cards expire this June. Alan Loesch is going to the Train-the Trainer course. Justin Hoover is also a certified trainer, but Alan would be available to hold training during the week. Chris Dietz made a motion, seconded by Glen Miller to reimburse Jefferson Township for the cost of the train-the - trainer course. All were in favor. Alan will set up some training courses as soon as possible. Also, Corey at Halifax Township may also be a trainer.

NEW BUSINESS – Chris Dietz made a motion to have COG send a letter of support to preserve Community Development Block Grants, motion seconded by Alan Loesch. All were in favor.

PROBLEMS OF MUNICIPALITIES –Tom Billow asked if anyone had heard about any reimbursement for the March snowstorm “Stella’ that dropped heavy snow in our area. Chris Blose answered that Dauphin and Schuylkill Counties were not included in the declared emergency area and there will not be any storm costs recovery from PEMA or FEMA.
